

- · Introducing the farmer to the modern farming ideas and technology in order to skill and strengthen them.
- Providing on field and off field support to the farmer and making them aware and familiar about the Government schemes.



- 984 farmers cultivated different agriculture products like:- Green gram, Black gram, Groundnut, Mustard, Sesame, and Niger were cultivated in 446.58 acres of land.
- Horticulture products like: Cauliflower, Cabbage, Chili, Brinjal, Watermelon, Beans, Cowpea Tomato, Onion, potatoes, and Marigold were cultivated by 4325 farmers in 561.64 acres of land.
- APC Balisankara marketed Cauliflower, Cabbage, Brinjal, Beans, and Green Chilli totaling 301.02 quintals, and received the sum of Rs. 13,06,778/-
- 100 HHs earn Rs.1.80 lakhs by OYSTER mushroom cultivation.
- Mango plantation in 21.2 Hact. & Banana plantation in 0.6 Hact. have been done by 23 farmers.

Project Goal

To "enable the poor tribal households to sustainably ensure their livelihoods and food security through promoting a more efficient, equitable, self-managed, optimum use of the natural resources, off farm/non-farm enterprise development and accessing the rights and entitlements due to them.

Objectives

- To build the capacity of marginal groups.
- To enhance the access of poor tribal people to natural resources & increase its productivity.
- To encourage and facilitate off farm enterprises.
- To ensure the basic entitlements of tribal households.

- 39 Village Development Committee (VDC) formed at all Revenue Villages and 39 Village development plan developed.
- A sum of 09 hectares of uncultivable land is all now set for greenery cover through the plantation of Cashew (07 Ha.) and mango (02 Ha.) along with maintenance of a 06 hectare mango plantation.
- Soil erosion is checked and the land has become cultivable due to the construction of staggered Trenches andfield bonding on 44 hectares.
- A sum of 79834 man-days generated amounting to Rs. 17,164,310 /- which also has contributed to the wage requirement of the labor workforce.
- 20 acres of land is now under irrigation cover and producing the all-season crop.
- 12 women from three SHGs have been identified and supported with 60 breeding female goats and 03 male goats (Buck) in 03 villages (VDA).
- 40 WSHG members from 4SHGs are supported with 2400 Banaraj Chicks for livelihood activities.
- One SHG is also supported with one Puffed Rice Unit.
- 02solar street lights have been supported to make the ST people move free at night in 02 VDAs.
- 20 people/ HHs are supported with 60 solar lanterns (03each) in one VDA.
- 09 very poor Scheduled Tribe HHs are identified and supported with one grocery shop, two tiffin centre, one ladies corner, two cycle /motorcycle repair shops, and three tailorings (Individual/ Vulnerable HH) for livelihood activities.

- To promote sustainable, participatory livelihood developmen through the "WADI" orchard model.
- To best use of the available land type and climatic condition.
- To improve the standard of living of project families leading to reduction in poverty through a regular source of income from their less/ unutilized wasteland.
- To rejuvenate the local natural environment in a comprehensive manner.
- To bring improvement in their social and economic status.



- The myth that "Wasteland could not produce" was wiped out. People started believed that "Wasteland could produce, supports to economy and environment" and thus practicing it successfully. In this connection alienated wasteland of 731 acres has been successfully converted into beautiful Fruit Orchards under WADI in the last two years.
- The creation of 38112 Person days in 2021-2022 helped to meet the wage requirement of the laborer force of the village.
- 293 farmers implementing different activities like:- Mango, Cashew, Guava, Pomegranate plantation, Intercropping and drip irrigation in 741 acres through convergence with Horticulture department in which significantly backed to the production, economy and/or nutrition requirements.

- 1634 farmers cultivated millets in 660 Hectors of land.

- 14 THRESHER machine distributed to 12 SHGs and 2 Farmers Producers Organization for the cleaning of Millets.
- 9 Pulverizer distributed to 9 SHGs through Millet Mission.







Objectives of the Project

- Restore degraded forest and augment forest resources through people's participation.
- Secure sustainable forest management by improving forest administration, community organization and other stakeholders.
- Conservation and scientific management of the Biodiversity.
- Promoting inter sectoral convergence for enhanced livelihood.
- Improve income of the target forest dependents.

- Rs.17, 24, 80,913/- generated through different convergence programme in 138 VSS of Ujalpur, Hemgir, Lephripara, Sundargarh & Bargaon Field management Unit (FMU) during 2021-22.
- 1st VSS level website developed and launched by Jhurimal VSS of Ujjalpur FMU in its own contribution. This is the 1st VSS level website at national level.
- 5862 Hectares degraded forest lands are now developed with different plantation activities in 150 VSS of Ujalpur, Hemgir, Lephripara, Sundargarh & Bargaon FMU.

MAA GRUHA (Maternity Waiting Home)



About the project

- To establish alternative support infrastructure for addressing communication problems in different tribal pockets for ensuring institutional delivery.
- To increase institutional delivery in the difficult tribal pockets.
- To provide the care to the baby and mother for seven days after discharge from Hospital after delivery.
- To ensure the exclusive breast feeding.

- 3705 Pregnant mother enrolled and safe delivery has been ensured.
- 97 % of Institutional delivery occurred in Government hospitals.
- 502 Lactating mother enrolled and properly sensitized regarding breastfeeding.
- 3705 Pregnant Mothers & 502 Lactating Mothers are aware of nutrition Food, Ante Natal Care, Post Natal Care, Immunization, etc.

- To improve the health and nutritional status of children by providing complementary feeding and services for health promotion.
- To demonstrate hygiene practices such as hand washing for children, food and water handling, feeding and preparing nutritious foods at home to the mothers.











- A good and effective rapport building was done with officials from the ICDS department, Gram Panchayat
 representatives, and local administration which has helped for smooth implementation of the project.
- 15 no's of Crèche centers have been set up in 15 villages with an allocation of all required accessories.
- Apart from the above-mentioned 15 centers, another 27 centers have been identified and are ready to start.
- 45 human resources were identified and boarded for work at the Crèche level.
- Orientation training has been conducted with all the Crèche staff.
- The concepts of the Crèche center have been shared in 55 villages through village and hamlet level meetings.

About the project

- Target Group- Scheduled Tribes & Other Traditional Forest Dwellers(OTFD)

Goal of the Project

The Forest Right Act has taken a historic step to support community based conservation and management by recognizing community rights to "protect, regenerate, conserve and manage" any community forest resource (CFR) for sustainable use.

Objectives of the Project

Empower village assemblies to secure their rights to customary forests under the Forest Right Act. Build capacity to replicate and upscale recognition of community land and forest rights in 9 blocks of Sundargarh district and 1 block of Jharsuguda district. Establish robust systems for socio-ecological monitoring of community lands and forests.

- Awareness programmes on Forest Right Act (FRA) were organized in 670 villages of Sundargarh and Jharsuguda district.
- 670 Forest dwellers are aware of their rights over forest and forest resources that they traditionally occupied.
- Reformation of the Forest Right Committee (FRC) is completed in 210 villages.
- Form Fill-up, Resources Mapping for Community Rights completed in 210 villages.
- Gram Sabha is completed in 102 Community Forest Rights (CFR) villages.
- 2100 cadres developed and trained about Forest Right Act.
- 28 Master Trainers developed on Forest Right Act.
- 38 CFR claims are finalized at Gram Sabha and ready to submit to Sub Divisional Level Committee (SDLC).
- 4 CFR claims have already been submitted at SDLC.
